1 Timothy 6:17-19 (NIV)

Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. In this way they will <u>lay up treasure for themselves</u> as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life.

START SHARING. CHOOSE THE QUESTIONS THAT WILL CREATE OPENNESS.

- Money is uncertain. God is certain. Share a time in your life when money proved to be that to you. Uncertain.
- What is one of your first memories of encountering extreme poverty or extreme riches? What kind of impact did it have on you?
- How has giving helped you put your hope in God and not in money?
- How do you feel about "the poor" being asked to contribute at church in the same way as those who have more? How is it dishonoring or honoring to them?
- When has someone else's level of generosity caused you to second guess yours? Why?
- How did you feel the last time you were extravagant towards God? How did you decide that you were actually being extravagant, and it wasn't just a large number?

START PRAYING. BE BOLD, AND PRAY WITH POWER.
