- Have you attended/participate in any of the events/moments that were shared on Sunday? Share your experience.
- Are you playing offense or defense when it comes to your Christianity?
- What was it about FLAG that caused you to be “willing” to attend the first time? How are you currently contributing in a way that would cause someone else to be “willing” to consider attending?
- What would you have done if you were attending in Spring 2010 and it was announced FLAG was challenging people to give above their tithe for 3 years to build a facility for people who weren’t here yet?
- Look back on your own personal faith journey. If you had it to do all over again, what would you do all over again?

START PRAYING. BE BOLD, AND PRAY WITH POWER.
