## WHO NEEDS GOD? – PART 5

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### START TALKING. WITH AN ICEBREAKER QUESTION:

- What is one of your first memories about God? How did it originate?

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### START THINKING. ASK QUESTIONS THAT WILL GET YOUR GROUP THINKING.

- What injustice has our nation been guilty of, as a nation, or as individuals, throughout its history?
- What injustice does our society seem most concerned with at this specific time in our history?
- Why do you think the existence of injustice is one of the biggest barriers between people and faith in God?
- How is our world/society hoping and expecting justice to occur?

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### START SHARING. CHOOSE THE QUESTIONS THAT WILL CREATE OPENNESS.

- What is one injustice in the world you would “fix” if you were God?
- What is a time you wanted justice, but didn’t get it?
- Have you experience a great injustice/evil/suffering that didn’t push you from God, but drew you closer to Him? If so, please share with whatever level of detail you are willing.
- What injustice do you see in the New Testament?
- Pastor Mark shared that “If you don’t want a God that embraces judgement, you don’t really want justice.” How did you initially react to that statement? After processing it a bit, how do you understand it better now?
- Process out loud why the Cross of Jesus best solves the dilemma of how God can be both a God of love and a God of justice. What other options could satisfy both? What other options to other religions/worldviews offer?

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### START PRAYING. BE BOLD, AND PRAY WITH POWER.

- God of love, mercy, and justice, thank you that you satisfy all of those attributes in complete fullness. Help us keep our eyes on You. In the Name of the sacrificed Son of God, Jesus, Amen.

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### START DOING. COMMIT TO A STEP AND LIVE IT OUT THIS WEEK.

- When you come across a moment where you wish justice was in your power, remind yourself that you would want mercy.
